



London Sport Cookies Policy June 2021

This Cookie Policy explains how London Sport uses cookies and other tracking technologies through our websites <https://londonsport.org/> <https://funding.londonsport.org/> <https://data.londonsport.org/> <https://londonsport.microsoftcrmportals.com/> <https://houseofsport.org.uk/> and <http://www.sporttechhub.co.uk/>. 1. What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer, laptop and/or mobile device, that contain details of your browsing history on the website and distinguish you from other users. They are widely used and help to provide you with relevant and personalised content and advertising, and help make websites work more efficiently. Your browser sends cookies back to the website every time you visit, so it can recognise you and can tailor what you see on the screen.

Although this Policy refers to the general term “cookie”, which is the main method used by our website to store information, we may use other tracking technologies through this website such as web beacons. The information included in this Policy is applicable to all such tracking technologies that we use.

2. Why do we use cookies?

- A. To let you do things on our website – for example, cookies enable you to log in to secure areas of our website, fill in application forms or view content.
- B. To collect anonymous statistics – the information collected by cookies enables us to improve the website through usage figures and patterns. For example, it is really useful to see which pages of the website – and therefore which of our services – are the most popular and how users are interacting with them.
- C. To improve your experience of our website – for example, to prevent you having to re-enter details when you have already done so, or by ensuring that users can find what they are looking for easily.
- D. To ensure that our website is secure – for example, to make sure that personal information that you give to us does not fall into the wrong hands.



- E. To provide you with information and content which we think is relevant to you – for example, to work with our partners to serve you with targeted advertising.

Internet browsers normally accept cookies by default. However, most browsers let you turn off either all or third-party cookies. What you are able to do depends on which browser you are using. If you do not accept our use of cookies as set out above, please don't accept cookies, or please set your browser to reject cookies. However, please be aware that this may impair or limit your ability to use our website. The option to do
